It was a clash of two hockey academies, the Jamshedpur one being sponsored by Tata Trust and Tata Sons besides technical collaboration with Jan Bovelander Hockey Academy, Netherlands (a Dutch coach with the team today had its advantage) and Round Glass being funded by Sunny Singh, son of Dronacharya awardee Sarpal Singh, a former Railways coach, based in the US.

The latter had recently organised Round Glass Hockey League at various age group levels with big prize money involved.

The scoreline could have been different had Anish Dung's reverse flick with an open goal in front of him not gone over the bar for the Tata boys eight minutes before close. Earlier too the last quarter saw some missed chances for Tatas. Round Glass started off well and had a better control in the goalless opening quarter. One wished Arjandeep was on field was on field for a longer time along with skipper Sanmukh. The two Rajbhars - Kunal and Shivam - did well for the Punjab side. Their defence was erractic.

Amit Kangori and Anish Dung Dung impressed for the winners.
